

- We created and conducted the SOAS Accessibility Survey 2013 and produced the SOAS Accessibility Survey Report 2013. We presented these to the Disability Liaison Group.
 - We met with staff from Dinwiddy House to create an action plan on improving physical accessibility in the halls of residence.
 - We met with disability advisors to create an Access Statement for Vernon Square campus, and to make an action plan on improving physical accessibility in the halls of residence. Some doors have already been changed to make them lighter and safer in the case of fire.
 - We released statements asking those involved in industrial action to ensure they took certain specific points into consideration to minimise disruption to disabled students.
 - We helped set up the Cancer Support Group.
 - We met with students and an academic to discuss including disability issues in SOAS campaigns, and how to campaign for better accessibility within SOAS.
 - We attended meetings of the Disability Liaison Group.
 - We met with staff from the Disability Office, Student Advice and Wellbeing, and the Students' Union to discuss issues that affect disabled students and carers.
 - We attended a focus group on updating the planning permission accessibility requirements for Islington borough.
 - We attended a meeting at the Transport for London office to discuss accessibility on London transport.
 - We attended the first meeting of the Bloomsbury Accessibility Forum.
 - We advised students on who to speak to when struggling with work, essays and exams.
 - We spoke with students struggling with staff and student attitudes, as well as physical limitations (not just mobility-related) that are caused by the inaccessibility of SOAS.
 - We contacted library and e-services staff to highlight some major areas of concern. Improvements are being made on the Accessible Study Rooms, and we hope to get more rooms for this purpose in the future. We queried SOAS promotional material and webpages as they were misleading as to the physical accessibility of the school library.
 - We contacted those running events at SOAS when we noticed that accessibility information on the SOAS website was inaccurate.
 - We contacted the Health and Safety Office to push for qualified first aiders at Vernon Square campus.
 - We contacted the Accommodation Office in the halls of residence to push for a fair and non-discriminatory admissions process to Dinwiddy and Paul Robeson houses.
 - We contacted Transport for London to highlight issues of physical accessibility and staff attitudes
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- We have gained some interest from speakers in the field of mental health for a future lecture series critically questioning dominant narratives, theories, and 'evidence-bases' of the psychological/psychiatric enterprises.
